**Invitation For Media Coverage** – The Dover PTO is excited to continue its Speaker Series by welcoming Nicolas Oreskovic, M.D., a pediatrician from Massachusetts General Hospital, to discuss ways in which we can all contribute to a greener world. Dr. Oreskovic will present and discuss the “Top Ten Steps To Going Green”. The program continues the Dover PTO’s “Go Green!” initiative, promoting environmental awareness of the entire Chickering School community to reduce, reuse, and recycle.

Dr. Oreskovic will speak at the Chickering School cafeteria on Wednesday, March 12<sup>th</sup> from 6:30-7:30pm. This is a parent and child event.

The presentation will focus on tips on going green for the whole family. It will include a brief introduction to global warming, followed by ten easy tips that families can do to help stop global warming. Dr. Oreskovic will focus on common household items that we often take for granted in everyday living.

Nicolas M Oreskovic, MD, is a practicing internist and pediatrician, and a fellow in the Harvard Pediatric Health Services Research Fellowship Program. Dr. Oreskovic’s research focuses on how the built environment can affect people’s health, particularly how it can affect chronic diseases in children.

Dr. Oreskovic is a Graduate Assistant in Internal Medicine and Pediatrics at Massachusetts General Hospital. He received his bachelor’s degree from McGill University in Montreal, Canada, and attended medical school at The University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry in Rochester, New York. He completed his training in Internal Medicine and Pediatrics at Mount Sinai Hospital in New York City, and is currently earning a Masters in Public Health from the Harvard School of Public Health.
